

## Pastor Notes

I am so excited to be sharing the teaching and preaching with Ann and some wonderful guests during this season between Pastor Toby and Pastor ??? – The PNC is diligently screening candidates to find the pastor God is calling to lead us in to the future.

In the meantime, just know that this church is in remarkably capable hands. The session and staff are not only amazing, but they are excited about moving forward on many items which they discern as God's calling for our little corner of God's Kingdom. We covet your prayers, your affirmations, but above all your voice, as we build the future together. We aren't standing still waiting for a new pastor to make things happen. We are perfectly suited to take action now for the Kingdom. We have amazing leadership in our session, our church family is solid, we show potential for growth each week, we are preaching and teaching the gospel, and most importantly we are building the Kingdom by loving God, loving people, and serving where called. I just got goose bumps

as I wrote that, but it's because I believe it with all my heart.

One very tangible way for each of us to participate in the life of our family is to come alongside the pastors and CLP's that will be teaching each week. As an experiment, Ann and I thought it would be interesting to list the Lectionary readings for the following week in the order of worship each Sunday. The lectionary is a pre-selected group of scriptures that follow a three-year cycle. It is used by many churches to develop the Sunday service. The spiritual statement made when many thousands of churches teach on the same topic on the same day is powerful.

There are four categories of readings:

1. Reading One is a passage from the Old Testament and a Psalm.
2. Alt Reading One is sometimes blank or sometimes is an Old Testament passage and a Psalm.
3. Reading Two is a New Testament reading or Epistle.

4. Reading Three is a Gospel account.

My hope is that many of you will take time from your week to immerse yourself in the Word. I used the word "immerse" in my sermon on Aug 26<sup>th</sup> intentionally because I really believe that immersion in Christ, whether that be in prayer, Scripture, and/or fellowship with each other, is the best way to learn what it means to be a follower of Christ. If you can read them all – GREAT. If not, please read the New Testament and Gospel readings, since those will primarily be where the sermon content comes from.

I could not be more joy-filled at the prospect of helping to bridge the gap between senior pastors. There are exciting things happening and glorious days ahead, but we can't get to where God is calling us without every one of our FPCC family. I leave you with the commandment that Christ gave to us – "Love one another as I have loved you" - Jesus

## PC(USA) Co-Moderator Visits FPCC

PC(USA) Moderators have nation-wide responsibility for the denomination during their two years of service, so it is an honor for the Co-Moderator to worship with us while she is visiting San Francisco Presbytery.

Cindy is a graduate of Whitworth College and Austin Presbyterian Seminary, ordained as a teaching elder in 1999; a four year reservist in the Navy with the Chaplain Candidate Program; and has been pastor of congregations in Ohio and Massachusetts. She currently serves as the Resource Presbyter for the Presbyteries of Boston and Northern New England. Cindy is married to the Rev. Eric Markman, with two stepdaughters, Lizzy & Cahaley. †

## The Great Commission Team – Making a Difference

### Gifts Around the World Coming October 21 and 28

Come to the Fellowship Hall on Sunday, October 21<sup>st</sup> or 28<sup>th</sup>, and purchase a gift card that will buy a sweater for a little Dalit boy in India that he will need to wear to his unheated school, or books for a child at the Raise the Roof Academy in Uganda, or a lunch pack for a child living in poverty in Contra Costa County. The gift cards you buy come with a Christmas card you can give to a friend or family member. Many of us have reached the stage where we have too much stuff. Receiving this as a gift will be greatly appreciated by both the recipients of the card and of the actual gift. There will be several tables so you can checkout all the possible gifts that can be given.

### Love People and Serve

Matthew 25:37 - "*Lord, when did we see you hungry and thirsty?...*" "*As you have done it unto the least of these, you have done it to me*". Members and friends of FPCC have a number of different opportunities to help the less fortunate, listed below. If you cannot help physically, you can always pray!

Whenever a month has a fifth Saturday, we serve at least 90 people at the homeless shelter for singles on Arnold Industrial Way. Once a year we prepare and serve up to 35 family members at the Diablo View Family Shelter in Martinez for one week (week-nights). We have committed to provide one meal a year for El Puente, Pat Noonan's organization that works with

Christian teens. 25 teens (at least half of them football players) meet on Monday nights.

We also support SHARE, a local food pantry, with donations several times a year, and this year have been collecting nonperishable food each week during the summer to supplement during the portion of the year when families with children in school do not have the meals available at schools to supplement their family food budget.

Contra Costa County has established a regulation that church kitchens where food is prepared for shelters must pass inspection. FPCC has started the inspection process, but not yet completed it. So for the September dinner at the singles shelter, we can accept donations of drinks and purchased desserts, but need cash donations to supplement the budgeted amount to purchase the main meal. We especially need servers. Watch for the table in the Fellowship Hall to sign up.

Winter Nights is a program that gives homeless families a safe place to live from October to the first week in June. Every two weeks, families go to a welcoming faith community where they are given breakfast and dinner and sleep in tents provided with sleeping bags and mattresses. In the evening the adults prepare a sack lunch for themselves and their children for the next day, as needed. In the morning they leave by seven o'clock for work, school, or the Oasis Center at St Vincent de Paul in Pittsburg, which has showers, laundry facilities and computers.

The adults who are looking for work get help to guide them through the application process, resumes and GED prep. In the evening, tutors and volunteers help the children with homework. The churches also provide some activities for the families.

Last year all the adults were able to find jobs, with the exception of one woman who has a young child with Asbergers for whom a babysitter could not be found. A number of the families were able to get into housing. Those who couldn't were referred to more permanent shelters, went to friends or family or back to their cars. Last year's numbers: 24 families (32 adults and 50 children) were helped.

What can you do? Pray that housing can be found for the homeless. Pray for the children who are living on the streets or in cars. Our church serves as co-hosts at St. Andrews Presbyterian. We are responsible for 2 days – dinner and breakfast, volunteers for homework and supervision and overnight. Food may be prepared there, but preparers and servers are needed. The exact dates we will serve during the first two weeks of May in 2019 will be determined later. Watch for sign-ups in April.

## ***Consecration Sunday is Coming – October 28<sup>th</sup>***

Congregations that approach financial stewardship from a biblical perspective do not view the money Christians give to their church merely as a way to pay its bills. Rather, such congregations see financial contributions as a way to help people grow spiritually in their relationship with God by supporting their church's mission and ministry with a portion of their incomes.

Our congregation's Finance Team has chosen again this year to continue the Consecration Sunday Stewardship Program as a way to teach the Biblical and Spiritual principles of generous giving in our Stewardship Awareness emphasis.

Consecration Sunday is based on the biblical philosophy of the need of the giver to give for his or her own spiritual development, rather than on the need of the church to receive. Instead of treating people like members of a social club who

should pay dues, we will treat people like followers of Jesus Christ who want to give unselfishly as an act of discipleship. Consecration Sunday encourages people toward proportionate and systematic giving in response to the question, "What portion of my income is God calling me to give?"

During morning worship on Consecration Sunday we are asking our members and regular attendees to make their financial commitments to our church's missionary, benevolent, and educational ministries in this community and around the world.

Every attendee and member who completes an Estimate of Giving Card does so voluntarily by attending morning worship on Consecration Sunday. We understand that some may be strongly opposed to completing a card, but the Service will be done in such a way that no one will feel

embarrassment if they choose not to fill out an estimate of giving card.

We will do no home solicitation to ask people to complete cards. During morning worship our guest leader will conduct a brief period of instruction and inspiration, climaxed by members making their commitments as a confidential act of worship.

We encourage your prayers and participation in Stewardship Awareness events leading up to Consecration Sunday on October 28<sup>th</sup>. We will make no follow-up visits to ask people to complete their cards, but we will make every effort to inform, inspire, and commit everyone to participate in the Consecration Sunday worship.
