The Garden Park Apartments (GPA) opened in December of 2004 as the first permanent supportive housing program specifically for homeless families with special needs in Contra Costa County.

Hope Solutions and Resources for Community Development (RCD) formed a valuable partnership in 2010. RCD is an affordable housing developer, established in 1984. RCD currently provides over 4,000 units of quality affordable housing to low income people. Their building projects are designed to nurture a healthy indoor living space and accessibility to public transportation, employment, retail, and essential amenities



Caroline Kurtz, missionary with *Maji Development Coalition*, writes: "I grew up overseas with

missionary parents. My mom and dad lived in Ethiopia for twenty-three years, and I only left to go to college in the US. In 1990 I returned to Africa with my husband and three kids (six years in Ethiopia and then four more years in Nairobi, Kenya), much of that time teaching English. I also traveled in and out of South Sudan and the Kakuma Refugee Camp."

Caroline's current project is lighting up the world of the Maji people in Ethiopia, bringing solar power to the region. Maji lies on the southwestern edge of the Ethiopian highlands, 8500 feet high, near the Sudan border. It was once the most remote outpost of the Presbyterian mission. The beauty of Maji's mountain views, waterfalls, and eyepopping sunsets gave Caroline Kurtz, the missionary these gifts support, endless joy as a child growing up there.






Flashlights and Batteries

The Ethiopian power grid ends 80 miles away from Maji village. The cost to bring diesel the three-day drive from the capital makes generator power unsustainable. While the solar project gets funded and starts functioning, flashlights are useful in helping these people cope in the dark.



Rural Community Center

Few resources and services are available to people

living in underdeveloped areas of Central Asia. *Frontier Fellowship* partners with a Christian-led community center that models the love and care of Jesus to over 16,000 people from 39 villages, most of whom are Muslims from numerous unreached people groups. This center is a hub of activity bringing opportunity and transformation through healthcare services, computer and internet access, a radio station and agricultural training. 




Satellite Internet Access for one Central Asian student for one year

Frontiers was founded to commit to bringing the Good News to the least reached corners of the world. It still seeks people willing to go to some of the most challenging places to share Jesus Christ's message of salvation with Muslims. Workers are now sent to 30 countries across six continents. Through recruiting, training, sending, and serving church-planting teams, Frontiers is inviting all Muslim peoples to follow Jesus—and dreaming of the day we'll see the Good News brought to every tribe, language, people, and nation (Rev. 5:9).

itnessing Elizabeth Prasad

Rev. Philip A. Prasad, founder of Witnessing

Ministries of Christ, was a Dalit ("Untouchable"), part of a group who, even as children, are rejected by the Indian culture. Presbyterian missionaries were his lifeline to connect to God. At nine years of age, the Holy Spirit inspired him to lead a life of struggle. After gaining wisdom and understanding, he returned to the pain of the Dalit villages to deliver the promises of God. He founded the Exodus Presbyterian Church, with its indigenous Education Ministry, to inspire this group of people for a better life.

The word "fulfilled" surfaces as Indian Christians describe their ministry experiences. "We want to work with our people," they proclaim. "If we do not go to them, who will?" The call is clear. Building relationships, village to village, teacher to child, pastor to elder through prayer and sacrifice moves them through the grace and mercy of God.

Clear pencil pouches to go with underthings we purchase locally for 50,000 at-risk children we are training in Safety Tips as we share the Gospel in Indonesia.





The mission statement of Winter Nights Shelter is:

To protect homeless families from winter weather by providing shelter in a clean, safe, and warm environment and to help them break the homeless cycle by assisting them toward self-sufficiency and into stable housing.

In 2020, *The Winter Nights Family Shelter*, which had been started as project of the Interfaith Council of Contra Costa County, has formed itself into a separate nonprofit. There have been some adjustments in scheduling due to the pandemic.

The shelter opens in October, closes in early June, and serves up to 30 persons at any

given time. The shelter site moves every two weeks throughout the winter, between hosting faith communities from the 107 member congregations that belong to the Interfaith Council. Congregations throughout central and east Contra Costa provide space, meals, and volunteers.
