Summary of Session Meeting on July 25, 2023



Approval of Agenda and Consent Docket

In the Consent Docket, Session reaffirmed its July 11, 2023 e-Vote approving the Commissioned Lay Pastor recommissioning forms for CLP Rebecca Chase and CLP DeVonn Powers for submission to the Presbytery.

Clerk's Report:

Session approved the June 20 Session Minutes and June 2023 Clerk's Report.

Member Jim Morrison passed away. The exact date of his passing is not known.

Session appointed Elders David Dowell, Jon Myers, and Maren Stanczak as Commissioners to the August 8 Presbytery meeting and Elders CLP Darryl McCollum, Jon Myers, and Jim Whitfield as Commissioners to the November 14 Presbytery meeting.

Moderator's Report - Rev. Carol Miles

- 1. Rev. Carol expressed her delight at the opportunity to serve as pastor of our church. She has been getting more familiar with the church over the past several weeks in anticipation of her arrival and plans to meet as many church members as possible and attend regularly scheduled committee meetings, Bible studies, and other activities at least once over the next few weeks.
- 2. The Commissioned Lay Pastor recommissioning forms for CLP Ruth Mejia and CLP Carlos Flores were approved by Session.

3. Rev. Carol announced the annual Leadership Retreat is scheduled for Friday evening of August 25 and Saturday, August 26. It will be held at the church and all church members will be welcome to attend. A special effort will be made to invite Elders and Deacons who have served in the past. An agenda will be made available soon.

Reports

Deacons – CLP Rebecca Chase reported that the Deacons have not met since the last Session meeting, so there is no report.

Connections Team – Elder Jim Whitfield discussed communications with the other churches meeting on the FPCC campus, especially to improve coordination, access, and cleaning of the church kitchen. Rev. Carol will initiate discussions with the other churches since Jim will be on vacation for the next 3 weeks.

Finance – Elder David Stearns reported that June giving was 91% of budget and July is below budget so far, with one Sunday left in the month.

David also reported that the increased expense for marketing by our media consultant, Church Candy, turned out to be less than anticipated.

CLP Darryl reported on the status of applying for a Google grant, through our contract with Church Candy. The grant will provide the equivalent of \$10,000 per month of FPCC advertising on Google. To qualify for the grant, FPCC is updating its website.
