Humanity Way - Helping Others



Humanity Way, Inc. is a ministry established by DeVonn Powers with its stated mission: "To restore humanity by providing for people's basic needs - whether disadvantaged, in a crisis, or need of emotional or psychological healing". It is supported by FPCC and has its offices on the church campus, as well as in Pinole and Antioch. Church member Ron Potts serves as a member of the board of directors, and Astrid Stancszak is a member of the staff. The staff

includes two career specialists who contact businesses to arrange temporary employment for clients. This provides work experience and opens the door for the client to find permanent work.

Humanity Way partners with Contra Costa County Employment Services and works with it to find work for the unemployed. Humanity Way also works with 59 other agencies and businesses to connect clients to meet their many needs. It has been recently awarded a grant from the Presbytery of San Francisco to help 60 unhoused families find homes. Humanity Way also works cooperatively with the Breast Cancer Navigation Program.

The FPCC quilters donate quilts for Humanity Way client families. Seven quilts were donated this past year.

During the Holiday Season and the cold weather, there is an increased demand for services, which in turn creates a need to hire additional staff. Financial donations and prayers will be greatly appreciated,
